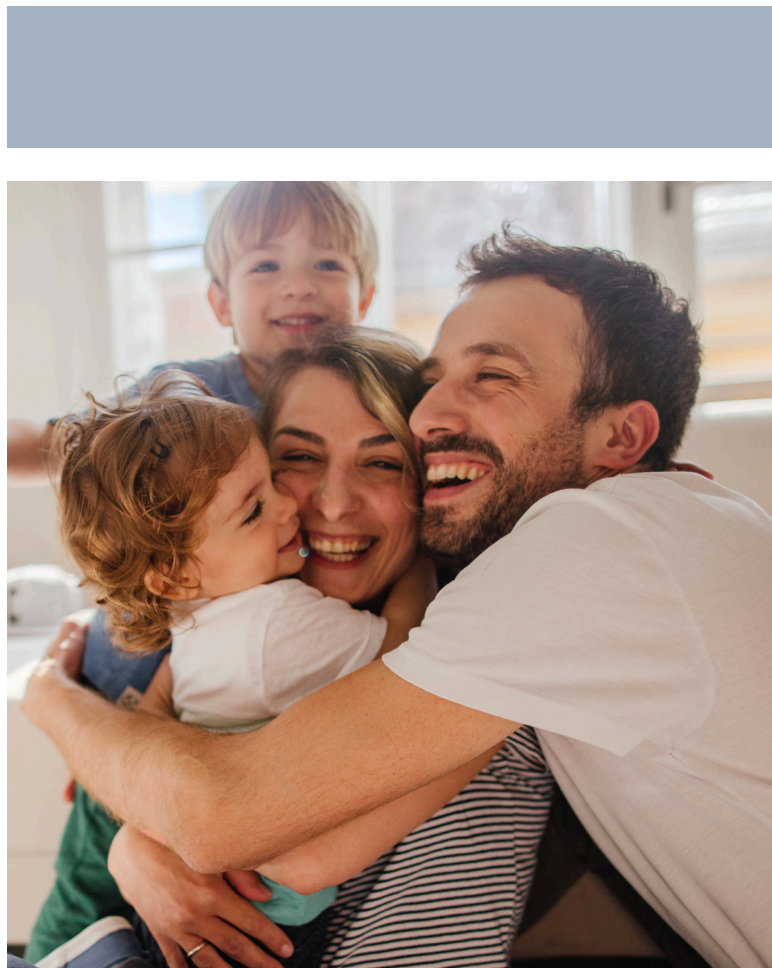

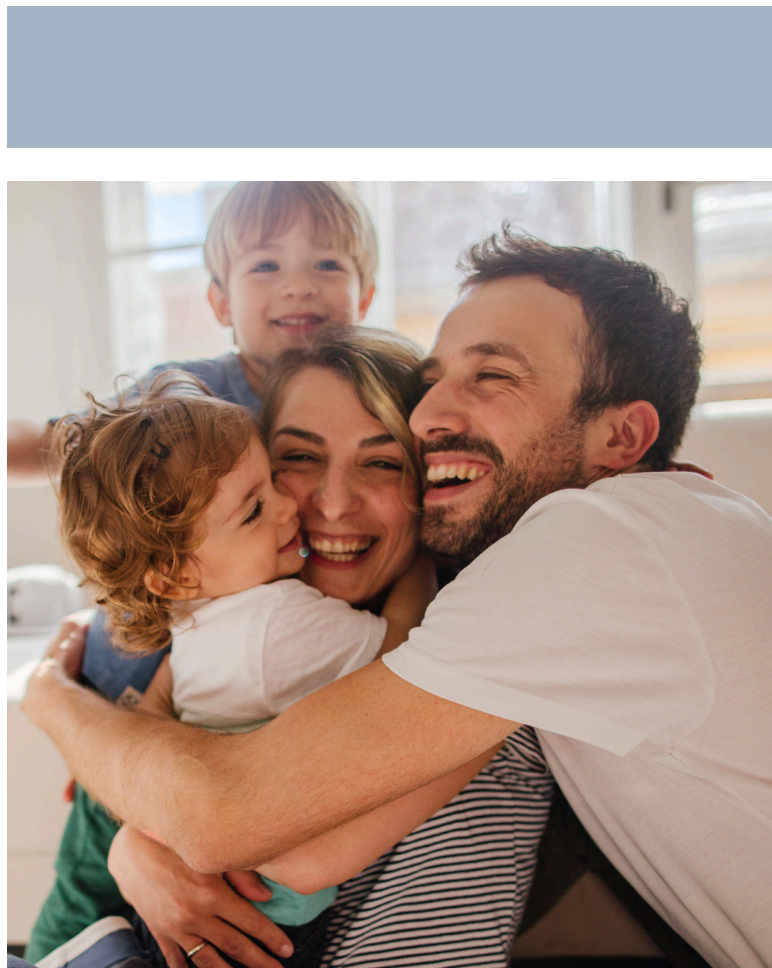

1.1 Activity

Have each member vote and use their favorite writing material to circle the ones that resonate the most. Remember, there is no right or wrong answer—some families may choose only a few, while others may resonate with many. This process is simply to help you clarify the values that should be represented in your logo

Now that you have identified values that resonate with your family, list your top values, including any additional ones your family discussed.

1.2 Family Mottos and Sayings

A family motto or commonly used saying can serve as a powerful representation of your family's values and traditions. These words can provide inspiration for your family logo, adding depth and significance to the final design. A motto can be a phrase that has been passed down through generations, a guiding principle that unites your family, or even a lighthearted saying that holds special meaning.

1.2 Activity

Does your family have a motto or sayings that you use frequently? Write them out on a second piece of paper. If you don't have a family motto, take this opportunity to write down common family sayings or create one together. Most importantly, have fun with the process! This activity will help spark inspiration for elements that could be incorporated into your family logo.

Examples:

"Through strength, we endure."

"Do & Hope"

"The Snuggles!"

"Work Hard, Play Hard"

Write down various family Sayings or Mottos:

Mountain Peaks – Representing resilience, challenge, and the pursuit of growth together.




1.4 Cultural & Historical Influences:

Cowboy Hat – Representing resilience, hard work, and frontier spirit.

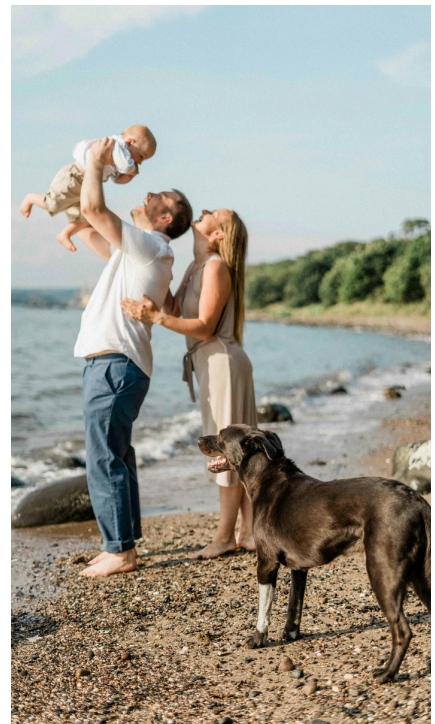
Think about elements unique to your family and region. Are there any historical achievements, customs, or artifacts you would like represented in your logo?
